President's Thoughts: Looking Back at 2011-2012

Let's all step back a second and remind ourselves how lucky we are. Few people every stumble upon the rare opportunity we have – to truly do something we love with a bunch of people we love. We have become a family, decidedly modern in that we reflect different genders/gender preferences/ethnicities/food preferences, etc. but ultimately one of our own choosing. No matter whether we have our little squabbles or our momentarily lapses into nostalgia, it all disappears as soon as the music comes on, we hear the magic

words – "Square up!" – and we instantly remember how we are all truly related... by our quirky but absolutely addictive and ecstatic love for something we all call "square dance."

Organizations are like living organisms; evolving and changing over time. I became President when the Club was hitting a major growth spurt and susceptible to growing pains. Just a few years ago, our membership hovered around 70, but then leading up to Convention, many people "came home" and rejoined. When I assumed the reins (post-convention), we were hitting 90 members. While other Square Dance groups around the country – both straight and gay, struggle and see their numbers shrink, we continue to grow.

Our club became much more prominent in the greater Atlanta and Georgia square dance communities; local folks from other non-square dance communities like the contra community joined us (Cis, Andrea, Deanna, Janet, Steve and more) and the country-western dancing community (Mark Wade)
Right before Convention, we experienced our first change in club callers in more than a decade when we welcomed Johnny Jones as our new caller. Post-Convention, both Johnny & his wife Penny settled into our "family" here, and Johnny's reputation helped bring in even more folks outside our traditional GLBT square dance community, as well.

Thanks to our Membership Drive in late 2011, we ended up easily breaking the 100 mark and ended up with 107 paying members by early 2012 – not counting the 10 new students we graduated a week ago. Of course a Club's health cannot be judged by numbers alone. For any organization full of so many moving parts to survive and thrive, the center must remain solid, and the core members of our board held together marvelously this year. I feel so fortunate to have had such a great group of Board members around to support me this year.

Undoubtedly a significant part of our increased energy within the Club this past year has been due to **Sherry Mask** and the string of exciting dances that she has put together. Though our object is not to make a bundle of money, we are happy when we don't lose any - and Sherry saw to it that we actually ended up more than breaking even for the year while putting on an exciting series of dances featuring nationally recognized callers.

As President Emeritus, **Danny Miller** did a lot for us by simultaneously taking on that role as well as heading the PDP 10 committee and bringing it into a prominent Decatur location. Everyone who attended can attest to the fact that it was a huge success. Danny also dedicated a large amount of energy to increasing our presence and established firm ties with other area square dance clubs.

As Treasurer, **Doug Miller** has been awe-inspiringly thorough and precise. He has been wonderful in keeping our finances up to date and in also providing consistent and thoughtful advice to the Board. As our Webmaster, **Wayne Johnson** stepped out of his comfort zone and quickly learned everything he needed to know and more. Wayne is a consummate trooper and is always there to lend a hand in every way he can. It is emblematic of his dedication how he and others went above & beyond to rebuild our entire website when all of the IAGSDC websites recently went down because of malware. Our website was one of the very first in all of the IAGSDC to be back up and fully online.

As Marketing Coordinator, **Eileen Stone** has been – in a word – phenomenal. She moved our newsletters light years ahead of where they were in the past, and she has put so much time and creativity into all of our promotional materials. She's a wonder.

As Christie steps up to take the reins, I hope that I am handing her an organization that is sturdy and sure, a Club that she can continue to lead into a bright future.



It's really not uncommon for people to take Mainstream 2-3 times before moving on to Plus. I suggest you speak with your club caller. He will tell you if you're ready. And thanks for the kudos.


Dear Tough Guy
