## Swing Me in Saint Louis!

May 22 is just a few weeks away and so is the beginning of four days of Square Dancing and communing with friends gathered from LBGT Clubs from across the land! It is our biggest dance event of the year; it's the 32<sup>nd</sup> Annual IAGSDC Convention.

But what is this IAGSDC you may say?

Below, Kent Tolleson gives us some history and background on IAGSDC.

In 1983 Modern Western Square Dancing (MWSD) took off and was popular as ever. The LGBTQ\* community wanted to be a part of this growing trend, but they met resistance from the straight square dance clubs around the country. So, the LGBT\* community decided to create their own square dance world and the International Association of Gay Square Dance Clubs (IAGSDC) was formed.

The original Association was formed in 1983 at the South Florida Fly-in. Members in attendance at the Fly-in came from The South Florida Mustangs, Western Star Dancers of San Francisco, Mile High Squares of Denver and Puddletown Squares from Seattle. Although not represented at this meeting The New Year's Resolutions are also considered founding members of the IAGSDC. Unifying principles of the Association were adopted at this meeting. The first draft of proposed by-laws was presented to participating clubs at the

Reno Rodeo later that year. Seattle Washington was selected to host the first Convention and Harlan Kerr of (at that time) Seattle was chosen as the Association's interim Chair Person.

The IAGSDC supports gay and lesbian MWSD clubs worldwide, including the United States, Canada and Japan. Our organization was formed by and for lesbians and gay men and for their friends. You do not have to identify as gay or lesbian to dance with an IAGSDC club. Membership is open to all square dancers. All IAGSDC clubs dance the Callerlab specified levels of MWSD.

Hotlanta Squares hosts dances throughout the year featuring fantastic nationally known guest callers. A good turnout for these dances enhances our reputation as one of the largest and most active square dance clubs in the state of Georgia, which in turn makes it easier to draw those top callers to our events. In appreciation of those members who attend all of the Hotlanta Squares' dances in the calendar year, free admission is

The Association is a non-profit organization of square dance clubs whose purposes are: (1) To promote Modern Western Square Dancing. (2) To enhance the image of the LGBTQ\* people, especially in the international square dance community. (3) To provide an opportunity for the social and dancing exchange of ideas among the member clubs. (4) To support and encourage the growth of its membership.

This gives you an idea of how we have evolved over the last 30 plus years. The IAGSDC holds its annual meeting each year during convention. Each membership club has a delegate represented at this meeting. The business of the organization is conducted during this 3 hour meeting. Delegates get to cast their vote on any issues that may arise during that meeting. Delegates also vote on future convention sites.

The IAGSDC is a 501(c)(7) registered non-profit. As such, it can accept donations, although those donations are not tax-deductible. To make a donation to the IAGSDC directly, contact the Treasurer through the contact page at www.iagsdc.org.

There is a long tradition within the IAGSDC of clubs hosting

'Banner Dances". These are locally organized events, usually for just one night. Sometimes a section of a fly-in is advertised as a banner dance. The club charges an entry fee for the dance, normally called by a guest caller. The fees collected, less expenses, are divided 50%-50% between the club and a donation to the IAGSDC. Banner dances provide a useful addition to the donations and membership fees that keep the IAGSDC and your own club running.
