THE YEAR IN SUMMARY

At this time of year, we make time for family and friends and often reflect on the past year's events. It has been a very busy, often hectic year for Hotlanta Squares and I wanted to take the time to review events and activities.

The year started with over 100 participants attending our 2017 Promenade Down Peachtree - IT TAKES A VILLAGE featuring John Marshall, Dayle Hodge and Michael Maltenfort. Many thanks to Mike Shagina for his role as PDP chairperson for this very successful fly-in.

Our first regularly scheduled dance of the year was our St Patrick's Day Dance in March with caller Jimmy Roberson, quickly followed up with our April "Swing, Slip & Slither Into Spring" dance with Lenny Newberry. Since we are more than a dance club, in May the club held a bowling event at Funtime Bowl followed by dinner at El Potro Mexican restaurant. As Atlanta's summer heated up, we held our June dance "Tidal Wave Beach Party" with Justin Russell which served as a warm up for the IAGSDC convention "Swing & Mix" in Palm Springs. Over 30 members of Hotlanta Squares braved the heat without the humidity in this truly fascinating desert city.

Although the month of July is normally a period of rest for Hotlanta Squares, not so this year as each Monday was designated as a dance night with themes of Hula Luau, Laugh & Dance, Nice Pear/Disco Inferno and Karaoke Squares. Thank you Edmond for your creativity and coordinating with Mike and Saralyn for holding these weekly themed dances. The month ended with another dinner social at Tortugas Cuban Grill.

The months of August and September featured road trips when members of Hotlanta Squares traveled to Gatlinburg for the Tennessee State Square Dance Convention, to Athens for the Georgia State Square Dance Convention and to Oxford for the Alabama State Square Dance Convention. August was also our first and perhaps annual Pool Party at Neil and Mark's fabulous Buckhead home. In September our club once again participated in the Pets Are Loving Support (PALS) Bingo Party where several members of our club were game winners. The fall season began with our "Back to School" dance with Pam Courts.

October was especially busy for Hotlanta Squares as Don Weston's "go big or go home" motto had our club participating in Atlanta's Pride Weekend in a big way. For only the second time in the club's history we had a booth both Saturday and Sunday in Piedmont Park and of course a big presence in the parade down Peachtree Street on Sunday. With a theme of "Hug, Dance, Repeat" and a bear as our mascot, we gave out close to a thousand stuffed bears over the two day event and helped spread the word that Hotlanta Squares is the only gay-oriented and always inclusive square dance club in Georgia. But no rest after Pride as the following Sunday Team Hotlanta Squares participated in the annual AIDS Walk. The month ended with our "Reincarnation" Halloween dance with Robert Townsend.

Practice, practice, practice is what we tell our Mainstream students and we put that mantra into effect holding our first Mainstream Blast in November benefitting members of our current class but also enabling contacts made during the Pride Weekend to catch up and join the ongoing class. A special thanks to Mike and all the club members that came out to support this 5-hour Saturday Mainstream workshop. A demonstration dance was also held in November at the downtown Westin Peachtree Plaza where we danced for the Association of Social Work Board. We even commandeered members from the audience and taught them some basic square dance moves.

But the highlight of November had to be our "We Are Family Dance" with Dayle Hodge. Thanks to the generosity of a club member, this dance was free to Hotlanta Squares members and friends but we took this opportunity to collect toys and money for AID Atlanta's Christmas Party for local children impacted by HIV. And our year-end "Whoville Holiday Hoopla Dance" will be held Friday, December 29, featuring Travis Cook from Kentucky, his first time calling for Hotlanta Squares.

So yes, it has been a busy and fun year for Hotlanta Squares. I want to thank all members of Hotlanta Squares because your participation has helped make these activities possible. It is no secret that we rely upon membership dues to help finance club events. Due to our overhead expenses, we typically lose money on class nights and hope to break even at dance events. Our PDP is often a financial success; thanks to attendance from club members and out of town guests this event pays for itself.



A: Spin The Top


